In addition, Len was appreciative of our club's service efforts. Jack B was thankful for a nice Mashpee Installation. Sam gave a Happy \$5 to thank our club. Mary Jane dittoed Sam, and was also looking forward to a new great-grandson soon. Susan loved her Birthday Song. Irene thanked Evelyn for inviting such a great speaker today. Ed was thankful for our club. Paul was happy for Kiwanis, and that the NRHS Football Team was 2-0 (and soon to be 3-0!).

Today's Program: Evelyn, our program chair, introduced today's program by saying she had been thinking about how to get the word out about Kiwanis. In her efforts, Evelyn came across the **Cape Cod Community Media Center (CCCMC)** and "found" **Linda Sandhu**, this morning's speaker, who is CCCMC's Communications Director.

Linda began by telling us that she lives in Plymouth and works in the Center's office in So Yarmouth on White's Path. CCCMC supports public access TV channel 17 and serves residents, organizations and businesses of five Cape towns: Barnstable, Chatham, Harwich, Yarmouth, and Dennis. It is a nonprofit, small business that broadcasts on all local cable services across the Cape; and is available online as well. Linda noted that commercial cable firms pay for the public access channels.

CCCMC allows anyone to do programs on any topic. It does not censor programs on its stations, apart from pornography, which can cause (and has caused) controversy (e.g., the "Gadfly" programs). CCCME is reaching out to get more people involved. The White's Path office has tools, training, talent, studio, editing capability and classes to help people create a well-done program. They offer classes on Thursday evenings and more advanced classes are coming. Linda noted that with today's technology, developing programs is much easier than in past years. As an example, she demo'ed her own \$99 VADO camera w/ external microphone capability. Questions included:

- Would the use of KI P/R tools and videos be okay? Answer: Yes.
- What about the Ch17 sound issue? Answer: The required move to high definition has led to lower quality sound, and they are working to address this.
- Is Ch 17 Cape-wide? Answer: No, just the 5 towns mentioned.
- Is there Lower Cape TV coordination? Answer: Yes, and the Public Schools have their own channel.
- Can our Club join as a club? Answer: Yes, and up to ten people can be involved. Also, we could hold classes just for your group – with up to 18 participants.
- Is it really true that anything goes? Answer: Yes, just about 😊
